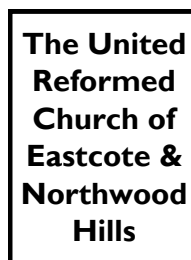
# AGM Chairman's Report

After a couple of years of re-locations, new pool facilities, insurance concerns and financial uncertainty, it is fair to say that the last 12 months have been far more settled and predictable.

The work involved in running a club like the Turtles has increased a great deal over the last seven years and much of that work falls on the Club Secretary functions. Alison and Nigel Grey work tremendously hard for the Turtles Club and I am very grateful to them both for their conscientious application and dedication. We have had a very busy social calendar and together with the tireless work of our Treasurer, Rosemary Noyes, Alison and Nigel have held us all together and organised some great events.

## **AGM Chairman's Report**

We have continued to use Community Transport mini-buses where ever possible and the special wheelchair access Chalfont Coaches for the longer outings. We have also provided the funding for mini-bus travel to the majority of the galas.

We renewed our independent insurance arrangement with Hiscox (via Swimsure Brokerage) for a further year. In December the Committee made the very difficult decision to end our near 50 year association with our governing body, NASCH.

Although the introduction of pool entrance fees was not popular with some of the membership, the changeover has been pretty smooth and we are now in a better position when dealing with Hillingdon Council and when applying for financial support and grants. We had already taken the decision to again freeze the subscription levels for 2015/16 and we are also not proposing any increase for 2016/17.

### **Thank you to all the Volunteers**

The club only exists because of the fantastic volunteers who support the Turtles.

At poolside, Jessica Grey has joined our regular young helpers, Jordan Mason and Alice Evans.

We are still very short of qualified swim teachers and we will be losing Sarah Harrington this Summer when she departs for University. We are very grateful to Sarah for all her hard work and wish her the best of fortune at university.

A special thank you to Patricia Bonney who has managed the system change over to pool entrance fees and the associated raffle. Patricia has managed the raffle for the club for many years and is also a Committee member.

Thank you also to Peter Jones who has yet again organised the British Long Distance Swim and also handled the organisation of the competitive data for our in-house Gala and Championships.

Huge thank you to all of the helpers who have assisted the club over the last year!

### **Pool Activity**

Linda Clarke (Chief Instructor) continues to organise the Saturday poolside activities and we have some rewarding successes with the tuition, but we are desperately short of qualified teachers. We have tried various different approaches to identify support but so far without success. The situation may well become critical in the Summer of 2015 when we lose Sarah Harrington and David Lee from the teaching team.

We also decided that as we did not have a qualified Diving Teacher on the team, that we should suspend diving tuition. Individuals may still practise diving from 5.45 should they wish, but it will no longer be tutored diving.

The special pool equipment that we have purchased over the years continues to be both useful and popular. In particular, the special swim belts, and so we bought 3 additional belts and also an additional equipment trolley.

The October Pool Fun Session was not as well attended as previous session but possibly because of the restrictions that Highgrove Pool placed on the session. We had been used to more latitude at our previous Fun Sessions at Hillingdon S&L.

Peter Horne has provided good support on the Health and Safety front and we have had no major incidents in the last year.

## AGM Chairman's Report

### Gala & Competitive Activities

The Gala team enjoyed another successful season taking part in 10 competitive events and winning the NASCH Region One Trophy. Unfortunately, more and more clubs are struggling to host galas and arrange travel to invitation galas. This year Stevenage Dolphins did not hold their usual gala but we were fortunate to be invited to the Lions Gala at Hitchin for the first time. As we are no longer members of NASCH, we will not be participating in the Region One Gala, nor will we be attending the NASCH Championships at Leamington Spa in November. We have also been warned that due to funding issues, the Lions Hanworth Gala is also at risk for 2016.

The Club was represented by 19 swimmers during the season, winning 177 medals (183 in 2013 and 174 in 2012) of which 64 were gold medals. Gary Lee topped the medal table with 20 medals, Oliver Regan topped Junior medal table with 15 medals.

Eight Turtles represented Region One at the Annual NASCH Championship.

Fifteen Turtles participated in the 2014 British Long Distance Swimming Association and won 4 category Gold Medals. The Gold medal winners were: Erica Beckwith, Shaida Ghorbanian, Don Lamb, and Gyllian Lucas.

Congratulations go to all our competitive swimmers who represented the Turtles and a thank you to the helpers and supporters of our gala squad.

### In Closing.....

I have really enjoyed my term as Chair of the Turtles Swimming Club. I am sad to be stepping down, but due to health issues it is not possible for me to devote the time and physical effort to the various roles that I have been covering for the club. As my treatment intensifies throughout the Summer it will not be possible for me to swim or contribute to the activities. Thank you for all the well wishes that I have received, I really appreciate it.

I hope to be able to return in some greater capacity in the future but for now I have offered to continue on as a Committee Member in support of the new chair who I wish all the best for the future.

Over the last 7 years we have raised over £25k through our fundraising activities and the club is now in a strong position. The gala team has given me immense pleasure but helping members, new and old with their swimming development still gives me the most satisfaction. When I see one of our members swim for the first time, there is no greater feeling.

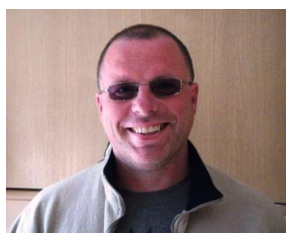
